Bikes for Kids had another successful year. Volunteers at the Essex, CT Wheelhouse worked hard repairing and safety checking over 1,000 gently used bikes. The bikes and a new helmet were given to young people who would not otherwise have had the opportunity to own a bike. The hard work of the volunteers allowed us to celebrate the delivery of our 22,000th bike in October. None of this would have been possible without the great support of our growing base of donors. We are thrilled that you all could join us in our mission and hope you will enjoy reading about some of our successes this past year.

### CHESTER ROTARY & BFK DELIVER BIKES TO HURRICANE RAVAGED HOUSTON

Back in the fall of 2017, a major hurricane struck the greater Houston area. Among the massive damage was over half a million vehicles underwater. Our people at BFK worked very hard to find a company that would undertake the cost of sending a truckload of bicycles and helmets during the aftermath of the storm to help some people, at least, with the next best form of transportation. However, none were available or their owners felt that they had already done their fair share of deliveries to the area. We were very lucky to be able to collaborate with Ron Woodward, owner of BJM Pumps in Saybrook, CT, and a member of the Chester Rotary Club. Ron and the Rotary were able to arrange, with local Houston Rotaries, the coverage of costs for a truck and driver to make the trip. Because of their efforts and the efforts of our own volunteers, we were able to load 213 bikes and helmets onto a truck bound for Texas. Children in need or having experienced a loss were identified and the Houston Rotarians distributed every bike within a week of the arrival of the truck. A big thank you is in order to Ron and all at the Rotary Clubs who lent a hand to make this happen.

For the third year in a row, Bikes for Kids joined up with the CMAK Sandy Hook Memorial Foundation to provide bikes for their summer program. Each season after school is out, 26 YMCAs in four states offer triathlon training for boys and girls up to age 14. BFK was able to donate just over 100 bikes to children wanting to take part, but not owning their own. The bikes were provided in June so all participants could ride during the summer in preparation for the big Triathlon at Camp Sloper, Southington CT in early August.

#### TWO SUCCESS STORIES IN THE MAKING

Dave is sometimes quoted as saying, "You never know what new opportunity is going to present itself the next time the phone rings." Well, it happened again. We recently received a call from our friend Ron Welcome at the Cathedral of the Holy Spirit in Bridgeport. They have been able to distribute several hundreds of our bikes to the kids in their city over the years. Ron and his parish have entered into a relationship with a very impoverished portion of a city in Alabama. The jobless rate is sky high and the children in the neighborhood really have next to nothing in the way of the usual "kid stuff" that many others get to enjoy. Ron is working on acquiring a truck to bring 200 bikes and helmets down south during the first week of December for distribution by Christmas. We, at the Wheelhouse are working overtime to get these bikes ready to go in time for the holiday. If you are inclined to help out as a volunteer for a non-profit organization, where no knowledge of bike repair is needed, we would like to hear from you.
